## Lisburn & Dromore Circuit

### Human Sexuality Conversations

**Wednesdays 11<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> April at 7.30pm in Trinity**

This is a conversation which is happening in churches right across our Methodist Connexion in Ireland, as we as a denomination reflect on a whole range of issues related to human sexuality which are so important in our society and church. This includes topics like domestic abuse, the sexualisation of children, sex trafficking, sexual abuse of children, pornography, and same-sex relationships. In 2016 our Methodist Conference directed that all circuits should have local conversations where we have an opportunity to think on these matters. On the Lisburn and Dromore Circuit we plan to have 3 evenings and will have as our facilitator, Mr Tom Wilson, who many will know.

The evenings are open to everyone across the circuit to attend; there will be an opportunity to be involved in discussion, but no-one will be put under any pressure to do so.

A booklet has been produced to assist the process of reflection on these matters and these are available for everyone to take a copy. It would be helpful if you could read this in advance of attending, and bring your copy with you.
